*Stands about  
6" high*

- 17"x15" Yellow Fabric
- Small Scrap (about 7"x3") Orange Fabric
- 6 mm Safety Eyes or embroidery floss for eyes
- About 1/2 cup Poly-Pellets (optional, but will help Duckling stand up better)
- Fiber fill
- Removable marking pen



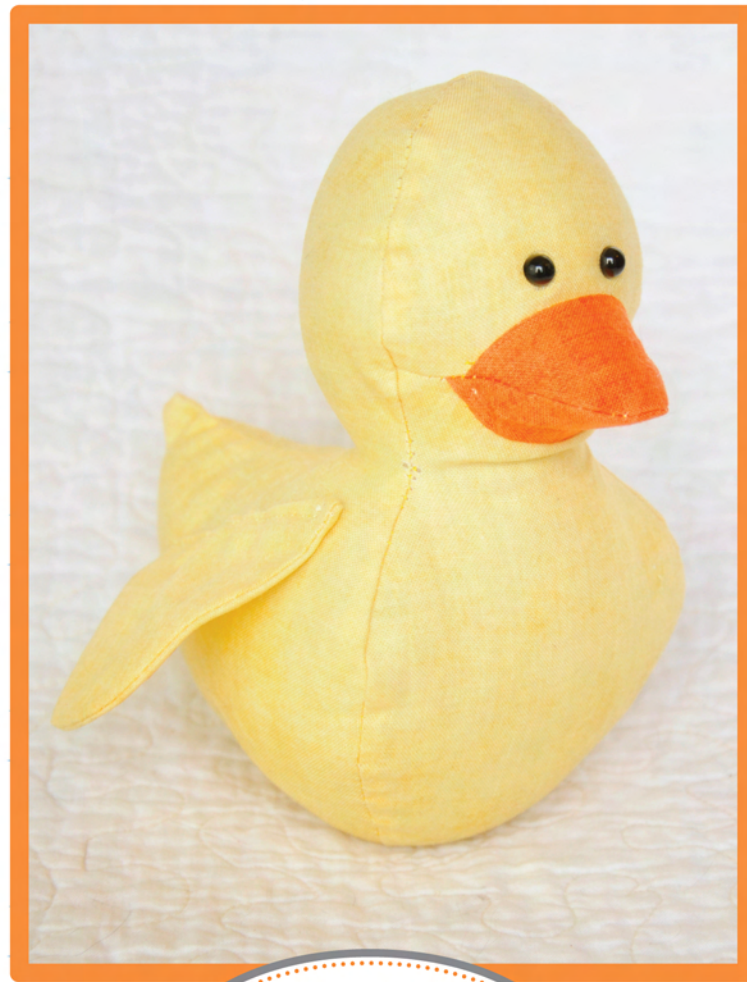

# Darling Duckling

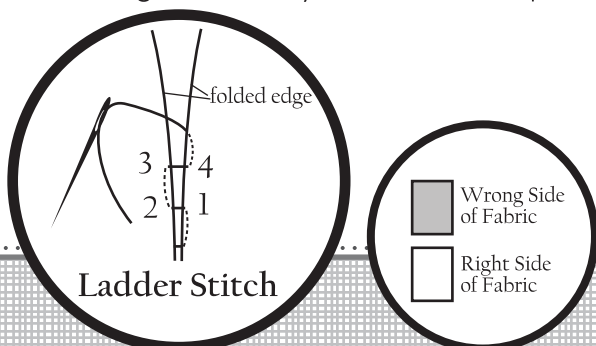
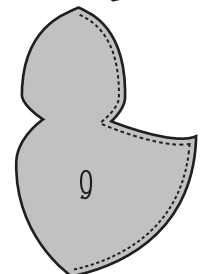
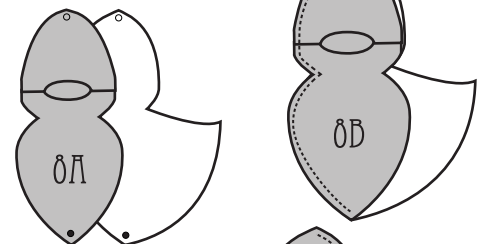
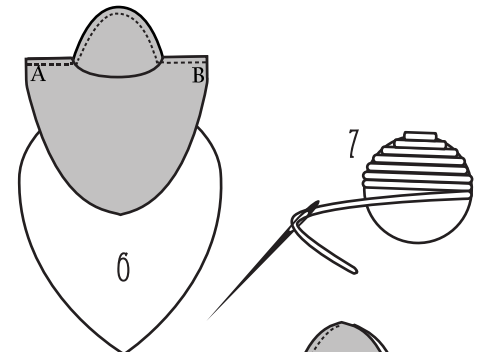
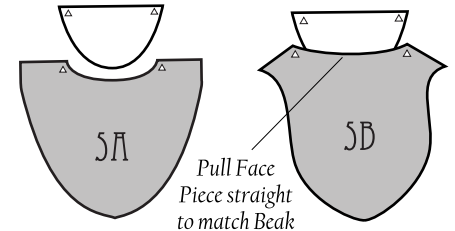
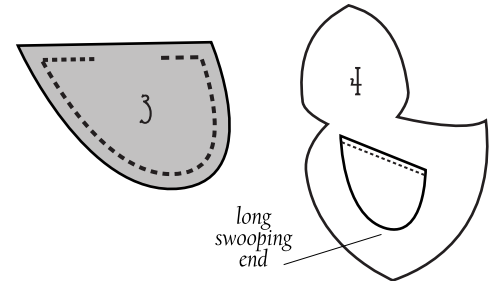

**Materials Needed:** 17"x15" Yellow Fabric, Small Scrap (about 7"x3") Orange Fabric, 6 mm Safety Eyes or embroidery floss for eyes, about 1/2 cup Poly-Pellets(optional, but will help Duckling stand up better), fiber fill, removable marking pen or tailor's chalk

**General Instructions:** Stitch right sides of fabric together with a 1/4" seam and press all seams unless otherwise instructed. To cut pattern piece in reverse, simply flip paper pattern piece over before cutting.

- 1 Cut out necessary fabric as described on pattern pieces.
- 2 With a removable marking pen, trace Eye Placement on the right side of the Head Piece. Trace Wing Placement on the right side of Body pieces.
- 3 To create Wings, match two Wing Pieces right sides together and stitch along the outside, leaving an opening on Top of Wing for turning. Repeat with second wing. Clip curves and turn wings right side out. Fold in raw edges and press in place.
- 4 Line up Top of Wing with Wing Placement lines traced onto Body Pieces. The long, swooping end of the wing should be facing the back of the Duckling (see illustration for details). Sew along Top of Wing with your sewing machine to attach wing to body piece. Repeat with second Wing on second Body Piece. Set aside.
- 5 To create Beak, take one Beak Piece and the Head Piece. Match triangles in Beak Piece with those on the Head piece, stretching the curve of the Head piece straight to match up with straight edge of the Beak Piece. Sew in place and clip curves. Repeat, sewing the second Beak Piece to the Front Body Piece.
- 6 Sew Head and Front Body Pieces together by matching right sides together and lining up Beak Pieces. Sew, starting at Point A, sewing around the Beak, and on to Point B, as shown. Clip curves.
- 7 Add eyes, following Eye Placement lines as a guide. If using Safety Eyes, insert post through the center of the Eye Placement guide. If using embroidery floss, fill each Eye Placement circle with a satin stitch.
- 8 To put your Duckling together, take your Front Body Piece, and one Side Body Piece. Match up circles from pattern pieces and sew down one side of the Front Body Piece, as shown. Repeat with second Body piece, sewing down the other side of your Front Body Piece. Clip Curves, especially those around the Duckling's neck.
- 9 To finish up, line up the two Side Body Pieces and sew together from top of head to bottom of tail, leaving an opening at the bottom of the Duckling to turn and stuff. Clip curves, especially those around the Duckling's neck.
- 10 Turn and stuff your Duckling 3/4 full with fiberfill. If desired, fill the remainder with Poly-Pellets; this will help the Duckling stand up on her own (if you're opting not to use the Poly-Pellets, go ahead and finish stuffing with fiberfill). Hand sew the opening closed.
